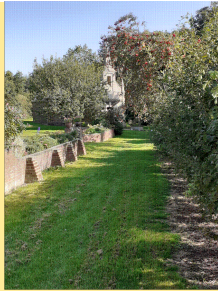

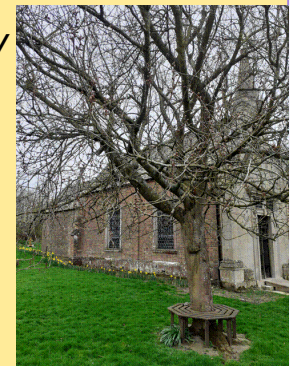

Organised Quiet Days in 2024

In 2024, we continue to offer a programme of Quiet Days at Ferrar House (using St John's Church as well). These will be led by local ministers – not all ordained, and not all Anglican! Held on the 4th Friday of the month, from February to November, they offer a chance to step out of your regular routine to be with God in a variety of ways.

Quiet Days will run from 10 – 4, with coffee served from 9.30 am. The cost of the days includes a simple soup lunch and afternoon tea. Tea and coffee are available throughout the day. The total cost for the day is £32.
